


- Self employed co-operative

Involvement with two MAJOR PROJECTS












- Two aircraft carriers
- £6.2 billion (US\$8.7 billion) project
- Four companies 7 shipyards
- Final assembly at Rosyth, Scotland



- UK Ministry of Defence did not have to use Forth Pilots – Crown Exemption
- Admiralty pilots or contractors could have been used
- Contractors were required to have a Quality and Safety Management System
- ISPO accreditation was crucial



- £4 billion (US\$5 billion) multi national project
- Caissons fabricated in Poland
- Bridge sections fabricated in China
- 233 bridge sections to be moved by barge
- Six years work for pilots
- 2 pilots on each barge moves

- 2.7 km long
- Longest 3 tower cable stayed bridge in the world
- Bridge sections weigh up to 750 tonnes



- Constructors did not have to use Forth Pilots
- Outside barge masters could have been used
- All contractors were required to have a <u>Quality</u> and <u>Safety Management System</u> in place
- ISPO and Lloyds accreditation were crucial in winning the contract
- Around £250,000 additional revenue





Last section – February 2017



- Open to traffic 6th September 2017
- Biggest infrastructure project in Scotland for a generation
- New world record in 2013 for largest continuous underwater concrete pour – 16869 m3 into the water filled south tower caisson
- Highest bridge towers in the UK

- ISPO certification :
- Will improve your professional standing
- Makes it easier to integrate with outside bodies
- Need not be expensive
- Can increase pilotage revenue
- An embedded culture of quality
- A better understanding of "customer" needs
- Better internal communication
- Greater efficiency and consistency
